

Brokerage Account

We are pleased to inform you that Mai Family Services has established a brokerage account to allow you to donate smarter. Donating securities instead of cash can be a very effective and taxefficient way to support your favorite charity.

STOP EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

In October 2016, Mai Family Services received its first state-funded grant, the STOP Grant (under the Violence against Women Act) towards creating an empowerment program for women. The duration of the grant is for three years and the total amount of the award is \$209,912.00.

The STOP Grant Empowerment Program provides minority women in Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw, and Wayne counties FREE Computer Skills, ESL, Financial Literacy, and Soft Skills courses. We also run a Support Group for South Asian women who have or are currently in domestic violence situations. Additionally, the grant funds child care and transportation costs on a case by case basis.

Since the launch of the Program on April 1st, 2017, we have hosted: 3 Support Group sessions, 18 Computer Skills sessions in Hamtramck (in collaboration with BAPAC), 17 Computer Skills sessions, and 20 ESL sessions in Livonia.

Our goal for 2018 is to expand the programs provided under the aegis of the grant. We will be launching an aggressive outreach effort and plan to take the classes into other locations in the Metro Detroit area – wherever there is the most need and value. We invite collaborations from other South Asian, minority, and mainstream organizations who may be engaged in similar efforts to help minority women.
