

The services provided by MaiFS fall into two categories: (i) Intervention – which includes providing confidential and culturally specific support services to South Asian individuals/families in crisis due to personal and familial problems and (ii) Prevention – which includes training workshops to build awareness on the problems facing South Asian communities.

Over the years MaiFS has continued to widen its services. Steered by the selfless work of the board, staff, and volunteers, MaiFS continues its work to build a violence free community.

# CSU (Culturally Specific Underserved) - GRANT PROGRAM SUMMARY

The Stop Grant for Empowerment, a mainstay with MaiFS for the last several years, has a new name! It is being re-christened as the CSU-Grant. While the name has changed, the focus will remain the same – help women of South-Asian origin deal with domestic violence and family violence situations, and become more empowered.

The Department of Victim Services (DVS) - State of Michigan funded CSU-Grant program has been renewed for a 7th year – a testament to the successful nature of our program implementation and the trust DVS has placed in MaiFS. In 2022 the Grant provided Domestic Violence (DV) Advocacy, Life skills sessions, and other forms of assistance to 16 participants from South Asian communities. The year-7 program is currently underway and the learnings from previous years, combined with the passion of our program's – staff, DV advocates, and Counselors are allowing us to streamline the program further to increase the effectiveness of the sessions on program participants, as well as in reaching out to more South Asian communities that could benefit from member-participation.

During 2023, the empowerment program is off to a great start, and a sense of renewed optimism that the CSU-Grant is making a difference in the lives of South Asian women and making them empowered citizens of our society.
