The CSU-Grant team is ending the year's activity on a high note! We were honored that the Grant from the Michigan's Department of Victim Services (DVS) through which we offer South Asian domestic violence victims and survivors with empowerment programs got renewed for a seventh year in a row!

At the end of a three-year grant renewing cycle, all DVS funded grants undergo a rigorous contract review.
