#### **WORKSHOP BY MAIFS**

#### CONVERSATION ABOUT SOUTH ASIAN CULTURE AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

On November 8, 2023, a very rainy and soggy morning, multiple members of the greater community that help and support survivors of domestic violence gathered at the Bloomfield Township public library to listen to a presentation – A Conversation about South Asian Culture and Domestic Violence – hosted by Mai Family Services. The attendees included members of local police departments, staff from area DV agencies, students, MaiFS staff and Board members.

The goal of this presentation was to familiarize advocates and first responders in the larger community with possible cultural issues that may arise in South Asian people who are experiencing domestic violence. It was begun with community building exercises to help connect the audience with each other and the presenters. First the factors that go into identifying someone's culture were addressed then cultural sensitivity was defined. We then discussed the stages of cultural sensitivity so that we all have the same operating definitions.

The presentation began with an ice breaker followed by a description of South Asian culture. The primary focus of the presentation was on the intersection of patriarchy and gender and how these shape women's experiences, especially within marriage and familial relationships. Barriers to seeking help in South Asian communities was also addressed. Finally, we looked at Mai Family Services and provided the audience with a brief synopsis of how we got started what we do and how we can work together with outside agencies to provide comprehensive care for south Asians who are struggling with trauma and violence.

Throughout this presentation a lively discussion occurred between the presenters, the audience, and MaiFS staff and Board members. This was one of the best parts of session as it was evidence of the audience desire to understand and connect with South Asian cultural issues as well as the effectiveness of the program.

The presentation was spearheaded by Imandeep Grewal a professor of education at Eastern Michigan University; Shanti Menon an academic who runs her own business in educational consulting and Preeti Venkataraman who is in private practice in child and adolescent and adult psychiatry. They are also members of the board of directors for Mai Family Services.

## CSU GRANT UPDATE

Since 1986, MaiFS has supported survivors of Domestic Violence (DV) within the South Asian community, delivering crucial intervention, prevention, and empowerment services. As part of this ongoing dedication, our CSU-Grant program, funded by the State of Michigan's Division of Victim Service (DVS), continues to provide essential empowerment support to South Asian survivors of DV in Metro Detroit.

This initiative offers crucial services, conducted remotely through Zoom by trained Advocates and Counselors in the areas of DV advocacy/counseling, practical English language communication skills, as well as in basic computer and financial literacy. In addition, the CSU Grant program offers limited tuition assistance to program participants to help improve their educational skills to make them more empowered.

MaiFS continues to seek collaborative tie-ups with local South Asian organizations in the Metro Detroit areas and their community members to expand the CSU-Grant program.
