Maifs LAUNCHES LIGHTHOUSE

Michigan's first youth wellbeing program for Asian American communities.

Mai Family Services (MaiFS) has achieved a remarkable milestone with the successful launch of Lighthouse, a groundbreaking initiative that sheds light on mental health and substance abuse issues impacting Asian communities in Michigan. The event brought together parents and students in a safe and inclusive space, fostering open dialogue and resource sharing.

Dr. Jason Vannest's interactive lecture delved into mental well-being and parental intervention at the right stage, while organizations like McAskil and Being Human provided insights into their supportive services. The student panels, featuring the University of Michigan (AA) team and parents Viji Velayutham and Sampath Prahlad, explored generational and communication gaps. U of M participants included Grace Lee and Arun Nagappan and moderator Ganesh Palaniappan. The MSU School of Osteopathic Medicine Substance Abuse Prevention task force delivered a powerful presentation on the impact of substance use on well-being. Krishna Gogineni and Urja Parikh shared valuable insights that kept the audience glued to their work.

Thanks to Rajesh Radhakrishnan for sharing his personal story on judgmental and biased views of the community. The short survey at the event revealed that academic stress and social anxiety are the top triggers for mental health issues.

Anu Gopalakrishnan, President of MaiFS, unveiled the blueprint for Lighthouse, emphasizing its student and parent-focused services. The program's talented leadership and event hosts, Manju Patnaik, Vyas Shenoy (also the emcee), and student leads Ganesh Palaniappan and Rishi Rao will guide Lighthouse towards breaking stigmas and empowering individuals to seek support. All student participants were provided with MaiFS community service hours certificate.


Maifs MAY OUTREACH ACTIVITES


