

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What is Intergenerational Violence?



What is Intergenerational Violence?

Intergenerational violence refers to when abuse and violence pass from one generation to the next within a family. If a child grows up in a home where violence is common—whether physical, emotional, or sexual abuse, neglect, or constant criticism—they may believe this is normal.

As they get older, they might think these behaviors are the right way to handle emotions or conflicts. This can lead them to either repeat the same violence in their own relationships or end up in abusive situations themselves.

Children who witness domestic violence often struggle with behavior issues like aggression or copying the harmful actions they saw. This can affect their future relationships and increase the chances of the cycle continuing.

But this cycle can be broken. Therapy, community support, and education can help people heal, learn healthier ways to handle emotions, and build safe, loving relationships. By raising awareness and providing support, we can help stop intergenerational violence and create a safer future for everyone.

MDHHS launches interactive Public Health Data Dashboard

The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) has launched the Michigan Public Health Data Dashboard, providing policymakers with a data-driven snapshot of public health trends in each State House and State Senate district.



The public health metrics currently include:

- Health outcomes, including mortality data, blood lead levels, low birth weight and more.
- Health behavior trends, including binge drinking, smoking and teen births.
- Social and economic factors, including housing costs and unemployment.
- Physical environment trends, such as pre-1980 housing.
- Clinical care trends, such as rates of prenatal care.

For each metric, there will be an estimate to compare whether a particular Michigan legislative district is doing better than, similar to or worse than statewide average. Additional metrics will be added in the future in order to present an up-to-date view of public health across Michigan.
