#### Rupani (Survivor name changed to protect identity)



A survivor was referred to MaiFS in 2016 by a mainstream agency. Her husband had been charged with a very serious felony. They had two children under the age of 3. He abandoned them and absconded to India to avoid facing his charges. She was left with nothing. MaiFS stepped in to aid with all her needs, such as food, shelter, and clothing. Additionally, she was given assistance with transportation, utilities, counselling, and legal services. After a long 7-year journey with MaiFS she obtained a divorce and got full custody of her children and finally received her U-Visa. She is now well settled with a full-time job and no longer lives in fear of

violence. She has expressed immense gratitude for the help and services provided by MaiFS.

#### Charita (Survivor name changed to protect identity)



A survivor contacted us after she fled to Michigan from another state. She was terrified that her abusive spouse would locate her and finish what he had started. She is educated and very independent but was paralysed by fear and lack of selfconfidence and didn't know how she would move forward. MaiFS helped her chart out a path that would empower her and assured her that she would be safe. A MaiFS caseworker connected her with an attorney who would guide her through the legal process that would lead to her independence and freedom. MaiFS also provided counseling, guidance, direction, attorney fees and emotional support. The survivor was very

thankful and mentioned that if it was not for MaiFS, a totally different outcome would have ensued.

## **Golden Club Program**

Golden Club is a service offered by MaiFS, specifically directed toward the seniors 60+ in Southeast Michigan who need support and help with basic essentials.

Though there are many senior clubs, Golden Club is unique because it is completely free of charge and guided by trained and certified social workers of MaiFS. Members can attend senior-only events and informational webinars at no cost.

In addition, you can request transportation to doctor's appointments, banks, libraries etc. You can also receive regular phone calls and home visits by an assigned dedicated volunteer.

### **CSU State Grant**

CSU stands for "Culturally Sensitive Underserved" grant offered by the Department of Victim Services (DVS). This State funded program is FREE to the survivors of Domestic Violence.

MaiFS offers FREE Victim Advocacy Services and Life-skills Training, with the goal of empowering victims and survivors of domestic violence to lead safe and independent lives.
